Did you Know...?

April is Emergency Preparedness Month in the City of Santa Clarita!

Did you Know...?

- After a major emergency you should be prepared to be self-sufficient for 72 hours. Fire department and law enforcement agencies, as well as hospitals and utility companies, will be responding to critically impacted areas and affected infrastructures.
- You should be prepared to use a fire extinguisher, apply first aid, and administer CPR.
- You should not shut off your gas unless you hear the sound of gas escaping or smell an odor. You should not use any electricity until gas leaks are secured.
- Disaster doesn't wait. Prepare for 2008! Visit the City of Santa Clarita Emergency Expo and learn more about being prepared for any emergency.
- Over 2000 children die in home fires every year. Change the batteries in your smoke detectors twice a year when the time changes.
- *EDIT (Exit Drill In The Home)* - You should have at least two exit routes from every bedroom and regularly practice your escape plan with your children.
- You should have a water supply calculated at one gallon per person per day. Store canned foods, blankets, flashlights, radios, water and first aid kits in a safe place in your home to use after a disaster.
